**ASSEMBLY SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1,
TO ASSEMBLY BILL 718**

AUTHORS SUBJECT TO CHANGE

1 **AN ACT** *to create* 253.105 (2r) of the statutes; **relating to:** requirements for
2 manufacturers of abortion-inducing drugs.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill provides that the manufacturer of any abortion-inducing drug is responsible for proper disposal of discarded abortion-inducing drugs and mitigation of the environmental effects of endocrine-disrupting chemical byproducts of chemical abortion-inducing drugs entering public waste systems due to the disposal of tainted human remains entering the wastewater system as a result of at-home abortions. Under the bill, if endocrine-disrupting chemicals from abortion-inducing drugs are found in wastewater, the manufacturer is responsible for cleanup, remediation, and further preventative measures.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

3 **SECTION 1.** 253.105 (2r) of the statutes is created to read:
4 253.105 (2r) MANUFACTURER RESPONSIBILITIES. The manufacturer of any
